Thoughts from the Pastor:

Dear People of St. Mark's,

October promises to be a month of growth, reflection, and thanksgiving here at St. Mark's. Each Sunday we will gather around God's Word and the Lord's Table, and I invite you to come expecting to hear the Spirit's voice in fresh and surprising ways.

Council Meeting

At our recent council meeting, we spent time talking about both our congregation's daily life and the bigger picture of where The Spirit may be leading us. The Synod continues to ask congregations in our cluster to enter into the "6261" discernment process, even though a clear framework has not yet been built. This is not an easy matter, and we are considering carefully what it would mean for us.

We are also continuing our own "Where Are We Going?" study. While I did not convene the study group in September, I plan to do so in October. This process remains a priority as we seek to make plans for our future.

Council also discussed combining our **Safe Trick-or-Treat** and our **annual Reformation event** into one celebration, which will take place at our fellowship gathering after worship on **Sunday, November 2**.

Worship in October

This month's preaching texts invite us to reflect on faith, healing, prayer, and the heart of the Gospel:

- October $5 Luke\ 17:5-10$, The Parable of the Mustard Seed
- October 12 Luke 17:11–19, Jesus Heals the Ten Lepers
- October 19 Luke 18:1–8, The Parable of the Unjust Judge

October 26 – Reformation Sunday – Romans 3:19–28, Justified by Faith These lessons remind us of God's faithfulness, the power of even a small seed of faith, and the promise of God's justice and mercy for all people.

Adult Bible Study

Our Adult Bible Study will turn to **The Hasmonean Period** — the dramatic years just before Jesus' birth when the Maccabees rose to power and reshaped Jewish life. This fascinating era helps us understand the world Jesus entered, and it sheds light on the questions of identity, leadership, and faithfulness that were alive in his time and remain relevant in ours.

The church incurred one unusual expense in August, \$1,500 was paid to remove a tree and tree cuttings. The financial information shared below represents income and expenses through August 31, 2025.

August Contributions/Income: \$5,398.14 (Excluding Investment

Account Interest)

August Expenses: \$7,031.48
